Thank you for the opportunity to quote for an upgrade of the character timber windows in your home.

Our EVS solution is well suited to transform these windows into triple glazed panels as well as protect and preserve them without needing to replace them.

The benefit to you being a warmer, quieter, and healthier home! Also you can retain all the rich character that Lead light, stained glass and astragal windows give to your home! I have also included pricing for traditional Retrofit Double glazing, but bear in mind that this requires the removal of the astragals and existing glass and as it is only 'Double Glazing' the insulation 'R' value is less than the EVS Triple Glazed system.

Please see below for a summary of your pricing options and a breakdown of pricing for individual window sets.

The breakdown includes Standard and Low E glass options for our EVS 'Triple' Glazed panels (EVSx2 & EVSx3) and the traditional 'Retro' Double glazed options (SGU & IGUx2) as well. Please note that the sash restoration and painting costs have been listed separately at the end of the quote under "Paint Specification". This work is required prior to installation of the EVS Double Glazing Panels and can be arranged by you or completed by us for the listed price. Our painting preparation price only covers the painting of the exterior faces of the sashes, it does not include the sash interiors, any of the frames, rebates or sills. I have not allowed for any scaffolding cost within this quote. If window work was to progress independently of other maintenance work then scaffolding would need to be arranged. We can arrange this if need be.

If you require rusty hinges replaced, we can do this at \$79 per set.

Interior thermal draught seals can be supplied and fitted for \$95 per window and \$150 per door. These are recommended for your opening windows, especially where draughts can be felt (Details of these can be found on an info sheet at the end of this quote)

Disputes: Without limiting any rights you have under the Consumer Guarantees Act 1993 we may or you may require a dispute that has not been resolved within fourteen (14) days to refer this matter to a suitably qualified person appointed by the building research association or New Zealand or any other suitably qualified person whose appointment is approved by ourselves and you. such person appointed shall in reaching a decision act as an expert and not as an arbitrator in this matter and decision shall be final and binding. The costs of that referral shall be borne by the unsuccessful party unless otherwise determined.
- 9. Promotional: You grant the distributor the right to take photos of this building, either before, during or upon completion. These photos may be used for promoting products and/or services in photo displays, advertising or any other form of product promotion. You also grant us to right to display signage on site before and during the treatment process.

Important Information - Please Read

- 1. Leaks: Please discuss any historical leaks and roof problems with your Roof Doctor, this will assist us to locate and fix them. Roof problems are difficult to see from the outside of your roof and will require special attention, these can only be rectified with your cooperation. This quote does not include any structural repairs to your roof or replacement of damaged or rotten timber unless specified in the quote.
- 2. Powerwash: A powerwash is a messy but totally essential part of the preparation process for most roof types. Do not be concerned about any mess, as it will be cleaned up at the completion of the job. Shrubs and plants that may get a dust film will cleanup with naturally with rain. Prior to power washing, outdoor furniture, pot plants, clothing on the washing line or anything surrounding the house that can be moved should be. Any personal effects stored in the ceiling cavity must be moved. If you are unable to do this, please ask our staff to assist. They are more than happy to help.
- 3. Water/Power: We will require access to water during the power/soft wash stage and power when the spraying starts. If you are not going to be home, a power cord under a door or locked window would be suitable.
- 4. Elastomerics: Owing to the Elastomeric re coating process used, your roof may have visual "sueding" effect in different lights. This is quite normal and will disappear when the "curing cycle has been completed and weathering occured.
- **5. Colour:** You should check the actual colour on a current sample before ordering. This is because written descriptions of any particular colour are of a general nature only and while colour charts and brochures are as close to the actual colours as normal printing processes allow, they should not be relied on and we can not guarantee the colour of each batch of production will be identical (this is inherent in the nature of the goods we supply).
- 6. Don't walk on your roof: Due to the curing processes involved we ask that the roof not be walked in for at least 6 months, as doing so may damage the coating which could affect your warranty. Always wear soft-soled shoes when walking on your roof.
- 7. Warranty: The Rinocote material manufacturers warranty is guaranteed for a period of 15 years against peeling, flaking or deterioration due to faulty manufacture & the workmanship warranty is guaranteed by the applicator for 5 years unless specified to the contrary on your quote. No warranty will be issued on a previously recoated roof. We offer a full weather tightness warranty on your roof for 90 days after completion of the work.
- 8. Scheduling: Your job will be placed in the queue unless otherwise specified. Due to situations beyond our control the earliest start date is an indication only and may change. We will do our best to get to your project completed when required, our team will be in touch with you at least a month prior to starting the job.
- 9. Overhead Electrical Lines: You give us consent for work to take place near a low voltage overhead electric line on your property.

Before you can make an offer, you'll need to know the method of sale being used for that home.

Remember, the real estate agent should treat everyone fairly, and your lawyer or conveyancer is there to support you through the process.

Don't make an offer on a property before seeking legal advice.



Agree on your goals

Decide what you're looking for and what your goals are. Talk to friends and family.



Sort your finance

How much can you borrow or afford?
Buying a new home comes with additional costs you need to budget for. Investigate and understand your loan options and limits before you take out a home loan.



You'll need a lawyer, an insurer and a bank or mortgage broker. You may need a property inspector later too.





Learn the lingo

The more prepared you are, the less confusing the process will be. Learn about methods of sale, types of property ownership and how to identify risks and potential issues.

Attend open homes or arrange a private viewing

By now, you'll know what you're looking for in a home and what red flags to watch out for. If you like a home and it meets your needs, you can let the agent know and start researching it in more detail.

Researching the property

When you've found the property you want to buy, it's important to find out as much as possible before you make an offer.



It may take a while to find the ideal property.

Doing your homework means you can make informed decisions, for example, you'll learn about the neighbourhood and what kind of natural hazards might happen in the area.

Understand the offer process

The offer process will vary depending on the method of sale. Learn about the different methods of sale.



Use settled.govt.nz's **Property Checker Tool**



Ask for a title search

A record of title is essential. It is specific to the address you are looking at and will tell you if there are any restrictions against the property.



If another buyer also puts an offer on the property you want, it becomes a multi-offer process. Ask the agent to clearly explain the process and make sure you talk to your lawyer.



You may repeat the offer process several times before you are successful.





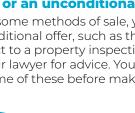
Confirm your finance

Now's the time to confirm your finance with the lender. Most banks will ask you for more information about the property and require proof that you've arranged insurance before settlement.



Make a conditional offer or an unconditional offer

With some methods of sale, you can make a conditional offer, such as the offer being subject to a property inspection or finance. Ask your lawyer for advice. You may decide to do some of these before making your offer.





Settling and moving in

Meet conditions

Any contract conditions must be met by the specified date(s).



A number of things need to happen before settlement day, such as your pre-settlement inspection and ensuring your finances and insurance are in place.



The big day has arrived! Many things need to happen in sequence between your lawyer, the seller's lawyer and the banks before the property becomes yours. This can take time, and you may not get the keys until late in the day. It's a good idea to plan to move in the day after settlement day.









Buying by advertised price, deadline sale or negotiation

Advertised price: The seller sets a price, and you can choose to offer more or less than that price and negotiate the sale. There is no specific deadline your offer needs to be received by.

Deadline sale: The seller sets a date, and you can make an offer at any time before that date. The seller may indicate the price. You can offer more or less than that price and negotiate the sale.

Negotiation: When it's difficult to estimate the market value of a property, a seller may choose to sell by negotiation. Buyers make offers based on what they think the property is worth in the current market. You can make an offer at any time.

Important things to know

- In all cases, you can attach conditions to your offer, like making the offer subject to a property inspection. You can change your offer at any time before the seller accepts it, and you can include an expiry date on the offer.
- The seller can also attach terms and conditions to the sale, for example, the settlement date.
- If you can't meet the conditions or need an extension, you need to talk to your lawyer or conveyancer and the real estate agent as soon as possible.
- If there is more than one offer, the sale may become a multi-offer process.

Buying by tender

When a property is for sale by tender, buyers give a confidential written offer by tender to the agent before a specified end date.

Important things to know

- You can attach conditions to your offer. The seller can also attach terms and conditions to the sale
- · You can make an offer at any time.
- The seller doesn't have to accept the highest offer or any offer. The seller may choose to negotiate, through the agent, with anyone who submitted an offer.
- You may not get a chance to negotiate once you submit your offer, so consider putting forward your best offer.

Buying by tender unless sold prior

Some tenders may be sold prior to the deadline, and this should be highlighted in the advertising.

- If the seller decides to accept offers earlier than the tender end date, the property can be sold before this date.
- Register your interest with the agent and ask to be informed if someone else makes an offer before the end date to see if you can also make an offer.
- If the seller has decided they will accept offers before the end date and there is more than one offer, the sale may become a multi-offer process.

Buying by auction

A property auction is a fast-paced, public sale. The property is sold to the buyer with the highest bid after the seller's reserve price is reached.

Important things to know

- Buyers should register their interest with the agent and ask to be informed if another buyer makes an offer before the auction date.
- If you haven't been to an auction before, it's a good idea to attend one as a spectator so you can see how they work.
- If you win an auction, you are committed to purchase the property. You must pay the purchase deposit on the auction day. It's very important to have your finances in order and to complete your due diligence before you think about bidding at auction.

Whichever offer process is used, remember that a sale and purchase agreement is a legally binding contract, so get legal advice before you make your offer.



Multi-offer process

A multi-offer process happens when more than one buyer makes an offer on a property. It's important to put your best foot forward in this situation as you might not get a chance to increase your offer or to negotiate.

Important things to know

- Agents must clearly explain the process and any relevant paperwork to all buyers.
- There must be more than one offer in writing.
 An agent can't say you are in a multi-offer process if there are no other offers in writing.
- In a multi-offer situation, the seller can choose the offer that works best for them. An offer with a lower price but fewer conditions may be chosen over a higher price with more conditions. The seller can also choose to decline all offers.
- If you have any concerns about a multi-offer process you are part of, you can speak to the agent's manager.

If you can't resolve the issue with the agency or you don't feel comfortable discussing it with them, you can contact the Real Estate Authority (REA). We can help in a number of ways if your complaint is about the real estate professional. For example, we can help you and the real estate professional or agency to resolve the issue and remind them of their obligations under the Real Estate Agents Act 2008.
